



AFPC Hosts Ukrainian Rada Speaker, Health Minister

On June 15, AFPC hosted a private dinner in the U.S. Capitol for a visiting delegation of Ukrainian officials headed by Rada Speaker Andriy Parubiy and Health Minister Ulana Suprun. Dinner guests included a range of U.S. specialists and statesmen, including former Under Secretaries of State (and AFPC Advisory Board members) William Schneider, Jr. and Richard McCormack, to discuss the current state of political play in Ukraine, as well as the evolving nature of relations between Kyiv and Washington under the Trump administration.

In his remarks, Speaker Parubiy called for greater attention and resources to be directed toward Ukraine by the Ukrainian government in garnering

Minister Suprun underscored progress made by Ukraine under her supervision on its national health system, and medical care provided to the country's warfighters.
